



Actress Paula Wilcox, now in her seventies, was best known for her role in the TV series Man About the House, which she starred in when she was only 19. Here she talks about things she wishes she had known then.

1 Now, when I look in the mirror and think, 'Oh dear, I'm getting older,' it reminds me that I used to do the same thing when I was 19 and 20. I used to look at myself and think I looked awful. I wish I'd known what I was going to look like fifty years



later because then I might have realised how gorgeous I was then. I looked great, but I didn't appreciate it. What a waste!
