MODALS OF ABILITY:

We use the modal verb **CAN** to talk about ability in present

I *can* climb that tree.
You *can* solve this problem.
They *can't* (can not) play tennis.
Can you answer my question?

We use the modal verb **COULD** to talk about ability in the past

I *could* speak two languages when I was in primary school.
We *couldn't* (could not) go out yesterday. We were busy.
Could he pass the test?
Sam *could* read and write at the age of 5.
