

# ENGLISH 1 SKILLS-BASED ACTIVITY BOOK





Bilim ve teknolojide yaşanan hızlı değişim, bireyin ve toplumun değişen ihtiyaçları, öğrenme öğretme teori ve yaklaşımlarındaki yenilik ve gelişmeler bireylerden beklenen rolleri de doğrudan etkilemiştir. Günümüzde bilgiyi üreten, günlük hayatında kullanabilen, problem çözebilen, eleştirel düşünen, girişimci, kararlı, iletişim becerilerine sahip, empati yapabilen vb. niteliklerdeki bireylerin yetiştirilmesi hedeflenmektedir. Anlaşılacağı üzere bireyden yalnızca bilgi sahibi olması değil, belli becerileri kazanması ve bu becerileri hayatının her alanında kullanması beklenmektedir.

Çağımızın becerilerinin öğrenciler tarafından benimsenmesi, içselleştirilmesi ve yaşama aktarılması için beceri temelli uygulamalara yer veren öğrenme süreçlerine ihtiyaç duyulmaktadır. Bu nedenle öğrencilere bilgi edinmenin yanı sıra bilgiyi beceriye dönüştürmelerini sağlayacak faaliyetler planlanmalıdır. Bu amaçla hazırlanan etkinlik kitabında öğretim programındaki kazanımlar doğrultusunda belirlenen bilgi ve becerilerin öğrencilere bütünleşik bir biçimde kazandırılması hedeflenmektedir. Bu hedef doğrultusunda konu içeriğine uygun beceri kazandırmaya yönelik etkinlikler tasarlanmıştır. Beceri kazanma süreci karmaşık olduğundan öğrencilerin becerileri yeni durumlara aktararak sürekli kullanmasını sağlamak amacıyla aynı becerinin farklı durumlarda kullanımını içeren farklı konu içeriğine sahip etkinliklere yer verilmiştir. Etkinlikler basitten karmaşığa olacak şekilde sıralanmıştır.

Etkinlik kitabında yer alan etkinliklerin bazılarının bireysel, bazılarının grupla yapılması bazı etkinliklerinin iş birliğine dayalı olması, bazı etkinliklerde teknolojinin ön plana çıkarılması öğrencilerde farklı becerilerin geliştirilmesini sağlayacaktır. Etkinliklerin genellikle farklı kategoride farklı becerileri geliştirmeye uygun hazırlanmasının yanında çoğu etkinlikte günlük hayatla ilişki kurulmasına ve öğrencilerde ilgi uyandıracak düzeyde olmasına dikkat edilmiştir. Ayrıca kalıcı ve anlamlı öğrenmeyi sağlamak için etkinliklerde öğrencilerin sürece aktif katılması, sorumluluk alması da beklenmektedir.

Stephen William Hawking was born on January 8, 1942 in Oxford, England. When he was eight, his family moved to St. Albans, a town about 20 miles north of London. At eleven, Stephen went to St. Alban's School, and then he went on to Oxford University, his father's old college. (1) he preferred to do mathematics. Mathematics was not available at Oxford University, so he did physics instead. After three years, he received a first-class honors degree in physics. Then, in 1962, Stephen came to Cambridge University as a PhD student to research cosmology, the study of the universe as a whole. In early 1963, just before his 21st birthday, Hawking developed a motor neuron disease called ALS. Although doctors said that he could not live more than two years, he completed his doctorate. and began using a wheelchair. 

This is the inspiring story of a courageous woman, Helen Keller. She was born in Alabama, the U.S.A., in 1880. When she was 19 months old, she lost both her eyesight and hearing ability due to an illness. As Helen grew into childhood, she developed a limited communication by using more than sixty signs that she had invented. In 1887, her parents contacted Alexander Graham Bell. He was working with deaf children at that time. He advised them to take her to a special school, Perkins School for the Blind. There she met her teacher Annie Sullivan, and their 49 years of friendship began that day. Ms. Sullivan was such a determined woman that she didn't give up on Helen despite her stubborn behaviors. The first word that Helen understood was 'water'. Her teacher began to teach the words by spelling them on her hand, first. A year later, she learned to read and write in Braille. Next, she attended different schools and studied on many subjects. She learned to write using a special typewriter. In 1900, she

was ready to attend Radcliffe College as a regular student. Ms. Sullivan helped her by translating every word in her hand. In 1903, she wrote her first book *The Story of My Life*. At the age of 24, she became the first deaf-blind person to graduate from a college. Her mission in life was to help other people, therefore she became an advocate for people with disabilities. Then, she founded the Helen Keller International Organization in 1915. Keller and Sullivan traveled to many countries including Japan. She inspired people in her speeches about 'not to give up' and she fought for the women's rights for equality. In 1955, she became the first woman to receive an honorary degree from Harvard University. Finally, she wrote 14 books, many essays and articles. In 1968, she died peacefully in her sleep, but her dreams are still alive with us.

### **DAY ZERO**

Can you imagine yourself waiting in line to collect water? Or have you ever heard of Day Zero? If we keep wasting water the way we do now, our answer to these questions will be "Yes" in the very near future. In fact, it's hard to imagine a country, surrounded by seas, is running out of water, but Turkey will suffer from water shortage in 11 years if we do not react to this. Only 3% of Earth's water is freshwater, including the frozen form in glaciers, the vast majority of it is salty water in the oceans. Two years ago, COVID-19 did not yet exist, and a doctor called Uğur Şahin, who is Turkish, gave a talk at a seminar in Berlin. He made a brave prediction saying that his company might be able to develop a vaccine in the event of a global pandemic. On Monday, it was announced that a vaccine for the coronavirus was developed by Dr. Uğur Şahin and his wife, Dr. Özlem Türeci. "This vaccine is more than 90 percent effective in preventing the disease that has killed more than 1.2 million people worldwide," Dr. Şahin said in an interview on Tuesday. Dr. Sahin, who is 55, was born in Iskenderun, Turkey. When he was a little boy, his family moved to Cologne, Germany, and his parents started to work at a car factory. His only ambition was to be a doctor, and he became a physician at the University of Cologne. In 1993, he received his doctorate degree from the same university for his study on immunotherapy in tumor cells. Early in his

career, he met Dr. Türeci, his future wife, whose father is a Turkish immigrant physician. On the day they got married in 2002, Dr. Sahin and Dr. Türeci returned to the lab right after the ceremony. The pair's main concern was to research and to teach. In 2001, Dr. Sahin and Dr. Türeci founded a company which developed drugs to treat cancer. They founded their second company. which has currently 1800 employees, in 2008. "They care only about science. Discussing business is not their cup of tea," said Sean Marett, chief commercial officer of the company. Even before the pandemic, the company raised hundreds of millions of dollars with offices in Berlin, other German cities and Cambridge. The two successful scientists live with their teenage daughter in a humble apartment near their office. They do not even have a car and they cycle to work.

When she was 19 months old, she lost both revesight and hearing ability due to an illness. As Helen grew into childhood, she developed a limited communication by using more than sixty signs that she had invented. In 1887, her parents contacted Alexander Graham Bell. He was working with deaf children at that time. He advised them to take her to a special school, Perkins School for the Blind. There she met her teacher Annie Sullivan, and their 49 years of friendship began that day. Ms. Sullivan was such a determined woman that she didn't give up on Helen despite her stubbor behaviors. The first word that Helen understood was 'water'. Her teacher began to teach the words by spelling them on her hand, Inst. A year later, she learned to read and write in Braille.
